Today, Glen Canyon Dam and the adjacent Carl B. Hayden Visitor Center are some of the most visited sites in Reclamation. The 50th Anniversary celebration will highlight the importance of the people and the community that have supported Glen Canyon from the early days of construction and the continuation of operations today.
